



## Conflict-free Minerals Policy

"Conflict Minerals" refer to tantalum, tin, tungsten, gold and others from mines and smelters controlled by non-government armed groups or illegal military factions from the Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries. The incoming from illegal mining is contributed to human rights violations and atrocities that have been committed in that country's decades-long civil war, including acts of violence toward women and children.

For humanitarian reasons, Fortune Grand Technology Inc including its affiliated companies completely supports wide-industrial rules of non-use of conflict minerals sourced from these conflict regions. In order to be compliance with the rules, we are making and will make efforts in the follow areas:

1. Don't directly or indirectly procure the 'conflict minerals' that are derived from or sourced from mines in Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries and assure the non-use of conflict minerals sourced from these conflict regions in our products.
2. Taking and will take due diligence within our supply chain to avoid use of the "conflict minerals" that are derived from or sourced from mines in democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries.

We will continual evaluate our policy of the use of conflict-free according to EICC requirements. Perform corporation social responsibility and contribute our efforts to promoting the development of human right career.
